

Traineeship in Toddlers with Autism Spectrum Disorders

Trainees (“scholars”) are funded by the U.S. Department of Education’s Office of Special Education Programs during their first two years in the program and complete a community-based practicum at the Autism Care for Toddlers Clinic at the University of Nebraska Medical Center’s (UNMC) Munroe-Meyer Institute.

Scholars learn how to assess, diagnose and treat Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD) using applied behavior analysis and receive the following:

- Two years of stipends, tuition costs, health benefits and professional development funds
- Workshops, seminars, and on-line training modules related to ASD in early childhood
- Direct experience with children with ASD and their families by working with therapists in the Autism Care for Toddlers Clinic
