



- Announcing a one-time course that will be offered Spring Semester (2022) entitled: **Improving Early Childhood Education through Program and/or Policy Change**. Dr. Marjorie Kostelnik in Child, Youth, and Family Studies is the instructor and she is also the former Dean of CEHS. The class is listed as CYAF 970 Advanced Early Childhood Education and will be taught in-person and via Zoom on Mondays from 4 to 6:50 PM. It will focus on the science of the Diffusion of Innovations and will include a variety of readings as well as speakers, some local and some national. Each speaker will describe a practice/program with which they have been associated that they deem successful and what they believe led to this result. Speakers will also talk about less successful efforts and what got in the way of desired processes/outcomes. While the course has an early education focus, the content is generalizable to both formal and informal early intervention programs for young children, their families, and the professionals who work on their behalf.
