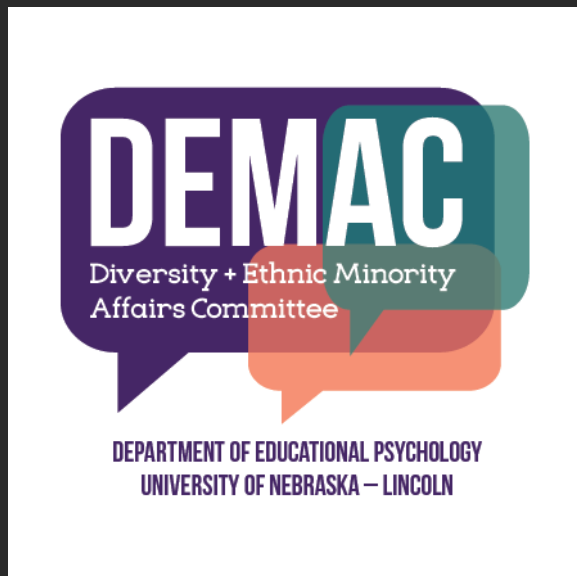

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FINANCIAL AND LEGAL SUPPORT


Student Legal Services

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


MULTICULTURAL EVENTS AND LGBTQA+ RESOURCES


SUPPORT FOR VICTIMS OF VIOLENCE AND/OR DISCRIMINATION

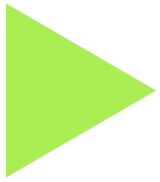
Institutional Equity and Compliance page
