

Adding a Provisional Endorsement Through the Nebraska Department of Education (NDE) and UNL

Adding a Provisional Endorsement in a Specific Area (i.e., ECSE, VI, DHH)

A provisional endorsement can be added to a regular teaching certificate. Currently enrolled UNL students wishing to add a provisional endorsement in a specific area of special education must meet the following criteria through UNL **prior** to completing an application with NDE:

- 1. Have employment or an employment offer in the specific area for which a provisional is being requested
 - Employer must email the Certification Officer, Dr. Sara Skretta (<u>sskretta2@unl.edu</u>) indicating offer of hire, start date, and request for provisional endorsement in the specific area
- 2. Hold a current Nebraska teaching certificate
- 3. Be admitted to the UNL Graduate College (https://www.unl.edu/gradstudies/home)
- 4. Be admitted to either the Graduate Certificate or Master's Degree Program (https://cehs.unl.edu/secd/)
- 5. Have an official UNL program of study set up by an academic advisor associated with the desired endorsement area. Contact Jill England at jill.england@unl.edu or 402-472-2141
- 6. Have a copy of the official program of study on file with the Certification Officer (can be forwarded by advisor)
- 7. Have completed 50% of the program of study.

To Apply with the Nebraska Department of Education

- 1. Go to the NDE website (https://www.education.ne.gov/tcert/)
- 2. In Section B, select **Adding Endorsement** and follow the directions. Please note you will refer to #6, **Adding a Provisional Endorsement** (not #7).
- 3. Complete all required information.

Please note that the provisional endorsement is *valid for three years* and is *NOT* renewable.

Adding a Provisional Endorsement as a Special Education Generalist

A provisional endorsement can be added to a regular teaching certificate. Currently enrolled UNL students wishing to add a provisional endorsement as a special education generalist, must meet the following criteria through UNL **prior** to completing an application with NDE:

- 1. Have employment or an employment offer in the specific area for which a provisional is being requested
 - Employer must email the Certification Officer, Dr. Sara Skretta (sskretta2@unl.edu) indicating offer of hire, start date, and request for provisional endorsement in the specific area
- 2. Hold a current Nebraska teaching certificate
- 3. Be admitted to the UNL Graduate College (https://www.unl.edu/gradstudies/home)
- 4. Be admitted to either the Graduate Certificate or Master's Degree Program (https://cehs.unl.edu/secd/)
- 5. Have an official UNL program of study set up by an academic advisor associated with the desired endorsement area. Contact Jill England at jill.england@unl.edu or 402-472-2141.
- 6. Have a copy of the official program of study on file with the Certification Officer (can be forwarded by advisor)
- 7. Completed at least 6 semester hours in special education.
- 8. Complete the Affirmation of Eligibility form for NDE (https://www.education.ne.gov/wp-content/uploads/2017/07/Affirmation-web.pdf).

To Apply with the Nebraska Department of Education

- 1. Go to the NDE website (https://www.education.ne.gov/tcert/)
- 2. In Section B, select **Adding Endorsement** and follow the directions. Please note you will refer to #7 "**generic Provisional Special Education Endorsement** (not #6).
- 3. Complete all required information

Please note that the "generic" provisional special education endorsement is *valid for one year*, expiring on August 31st of the year following the issuance. This endorsement can renewed twice by completing a minimum of 9 semester hours of approved coursework and completing the renewal application through NDE by their stated deadline.
