

Martha McCarthy, Chancellor Professor and Chair of the Educational Leadership Program at Indiana University, specializes in education law and policy.

She has served as President of NOLPE (1984-85) and UCEA (1985-86) and Vice-President for Division A of AERA (1992-94). She has received the Research Competition Award from AASA (1980), the President's Award for Outstanding Contributions to Education from the Indiana Pricipals' Association (1988), the Contribution to Knowledge Award form the Indiana Association of School Leaders (1991), the Tracy M. Sonneborn Award for Distinction in Teaching and Research at Indiana University (1991), the McGhehey Award for Outstanding Contributions to the Field of School Law from the Education Law Association (1992), and the Indiana University Distinguished Scholar Award (1993).

She has authored or coauthored books and articles on students' and teachers' rights, equity issues, church-state relations, curriculum censorship, education reform efforts, and characteristics of students and faculty in administrative preparation programs.
