

Eric Buhs and Carrie Clark (EDPS) and Dr. Yingying Wang (SECD) for their tireless work on the Educational Neuroscience Graduate Certificate that was approved by the Board of Regents at the December 3, 2021 meeting! This innovative, cutting-edge certificate program will be offered starting in Fall 2022. The certificate will be an in-person 12-credit hour program designed to provide competencies in foundational neuroscience principles, neuroanatomy and analytical techniques, neural foundations of speech/language development and literacy, and the interpretation of neuroscience principles related to emotional and cognitive development. This certificate will help graduate students' career development and future job searches, as school districts are applying educational neuroscience research to classroom and extracurricular settings. All coursework will partially satisfy requirements toward master's degree programs in Special Education and Communication Disorders and in Educational Psychology.



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
