

We are pleased to welcome Dr. Tim Moses as a research professor in the Buros Center for Testing at the University of Nebraska–Lincoln. With more than 20 years of experience in psychometrics at Educational Testing Service and the College Board, Tim brings deep expertise in large-scale educational assessments, including college admissions, K-12 testing, and certification exams. His work spans both traditional procedures, such as equating and item analysis, and innovative approaches, such as automated essay scoring. Tim has also played a key role in updating and transitioning long-standing testing programs, demonstrating his dedication to improving the field.

Drs. Janet F. Carlson and Jessica L. Jonson, research faculty members and Buros Center for Testing associate directors, have co-authored a chapter titled "Fairness and Bias in Educational and Psychological Testing" in the recently published Essentials of Culture in Psychological Assessment. Edited by Dr. A. <u> A story from Sungeun:</u>

In Korean tradition, eating Tteokguk (rice cake soup) is a cherished part of Seollal (Lunar New Year). There's a lovely meaning behind it – they say each bowl of soup makes you a year older, bringing good fortune along the way. The white, coinshaped rice cakes swimming in clear broth are meant to symbolize prosperity and a fresh start.

My friends and I used to tease each other about skipping the Tteokguk to avoid getting older - though we never actually did, of course. While it marks another year passed, sharing this special soup has always been a wonderful way to welcome the new year and reflect on what's ahead.


