This study skills strategy utilizes a procedure called "task analysis." *Task analysis* is the process of taking a large task or assignment and breaking it into subcomponent or smaller tasks, and estimating task completion time for each subcomponent. The task analysis is used to help students organize their assignments and time necessary to complete them.
